

Food for thought from J

October 17, 2021



As a pastor, over the years, I have heard quite a few reasons/excuses for why people do not attend or have stopped attending and supporting a local church on a regular basis. The top three reasons I have encountered are — in order of frequency (and in my personal experience):

- 1. The church is full of hypocrites.
- 2. I can't find a church that meets my needs.
- 3. I don't need a church to worship God. I can do that just fine by myself on the golf course, the beach, deer stand you fill in the blank.

Now, taking these objections to engagement with a local church in order, there is no question the church is full of hypocrites. We are all hypocritical at times, and it has been that way since the beginning. Hypocrisy was one of the conditions for which Jesus reserved his harshest criticism, referring to the hypocritical religious leaders of his day as a "brood of vipers." And this was not necessarily meant to insult these people. It was a statement of the danger they and their hypocrisy presented to the church, to the people they were supposed to be leading, and to the coming of God's kingdom. So, isn't it wonderful that even though Jesus himself was surrounded by such hypocrites, he didn't give up on the church or turn his back on his mission because of it?

As for finding a church that "meets our needs," it is certainly natural to desire and to seek just that. We all want a church that offers Christian community, education, ministries, programming, and worship that is comfortable and exciting and that draws us closer to God. We want good preaching and programs for our children and youth. But perhaps we should consider the possibility that we might have a better chance of finding that elusive, utopian church experience if we focused on using our gifts to meet the needs of the church rather than making ourselves the center of the equation, and always expecting someone else to do the work that makes the church special.

Finally, we can and should take every opportunity to consider and appreciate nature and God's creation all around us – looking for God's divine and masterful hand in our everyday lives. We can all experience God's majesty in an oceanside sunrise, a peaceful morning filled with birds singing, or the looks of joy on the faces of children and grandchildren at play. But appreciating and even worshiping God is only a part of God's plan for us and our obligations as stewards of the lives we have been given to live by God. We must also be seeking to grow in our knowledge of God through diligent study of God's holy word, and we must be participants in the work of God's kingdom, sharing the gospel, making disciples, hearing and responding to the cries of the needy.

This is where the blessing of the church comes in, and it's the reason why the above objections to embracing the blessing of being part of a church family are actually dangerous excuses that separate those who espouse them from the abundant life Christ wants for them. Through the institution of the church, God has given us a community of fellow travelers on the journey of following in the footsteps of that cloud of witnesses who came before us and showed us what it means to work diligently and with endurance toward the promises God has given us. When we support the church with our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness, we not only fulfill our individual obligation as good and faithful servants, we also help our brothers and sisters in Christ along the way.

As we consider what it means to be good stewards of our many blessings, we must always remember the role of the church in providing us with the blessing of focus and opportunity to grow personally, to serve others, and to be strengthened for the future through Christian community and fellowship. Because yes, we were born to run, but we don't have to run alone.
